INTRODUCTION.

The first Eagle House was a large residence at Brook Green, Hammersmith. Here in 1820 Joseph Railton, a schoolmaster from Cumberland, opened a private preparatory school for gentlemen's sons, and so laid the foundation of a school which has had an unbroken career of eighty-eight years in training boys for the Public Schools. After thirteen years of successful work Mr. Railton handed over the school to the Rev. Edward Wickham, a member of a family subsequently well known in scholastic work. For fifteen years Mr. Wickham governed the school, increasing its success and reputation by sending to the Public Schools a large number of distinguished pupils. It is enough to mention the names of Dr. Montagu Butler, Master of Trinity College, Cambridge, Dr. Ridding, Head Master of Winchester, afterwards Bishop of Southwell, Rev. A. G. Butler, Head Master of Haileybury, Dr. Warre, Head Master of Eton, Dr. Faber, Head Master of Malvern, Dr. Wickham, Head Master of Wellington, Dr. Blore, Head Master of Canterbury, to show that Eagle House at that time was supplying the Public Schools with excellent material, and it speaks well for the spirit of the School that even yet Dr. H. M. Butler and Dr. Warre (to name only two) have shown a living interest in the old School. In 1848 Mr. Wickham passed the School on to Rev. E. Huntingford, another Wykehamist, under whose wise and able guidance the school continued to flourish. Two great events marked Dr. Huntingford's Headmastership. The first was the removal of the school from Brook Green to Wimbledon in 1860. Here the Head found a house, which, under the name of Nelson House, had been used as a School for many years under Stoton and Mayor, and had just been vacated by Mr. Brackenbury. This is rather a famous house and has now been restored to its original form by a well known architect. The second innovation was the erection of a chapel which was constructed in 1861, and which still serves its original purpose as a place of worship for Eagle House Boys. That Dr. Huntingford was a Head of remarkable power has been shown by the very extraordinary interest and enthusiasm that was evoked among his old pupils, when the memorial window and tablet were erected at Eagle House and in Winchester Cathedral,

respectively. That men who had only been under him as little boys before their Public School days should still feel so strongly what they owed to him more than thirty years after he had retired from school work, is an almost unparalleled tribute to his qualities as a Head Master. In 1872 Dr. Huntingford assumed as Joint Head Master his son-in-law the Rev. A. N. Malan, and after two years of partnership transferred the school to the latter. In 1874 Mr., now Dr., Malan began his Headmastership, and for twelve years he carried on the school in the second Eagle House at Wimbledon, continuing to send numbers of boys to the leading Public Schools, where many distinguished themselves. As so many great Head Masters sprang from Eagle House in its old days, it is well to mention that among Dr. Malan's pupils were the Rev. Dr. Pollock, Head Master of Wellington and the Rev. L. G. B. J. Ford, Head Master of Repton.

But as the great growth of town had now reached Wimbledon also, Dr. Malan decided that the School must be moved quite into the country, and in 1886 he carried the boys and the Chapel and many other belongings of the old School to the present Eagle House, which lies on the road between Wellington College and the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, Berks. Here in its beautiful new home, Dr. Malan, ably aided by Mrs. Malan, Dr. Huntingford's daughter, continued to carry on the school as a successful nursery for the Public Schools, for nearly twenty years. The work of these years left results not only on the pupils of the school, but in *many improvements both scholastic and artistic which are a permanent monument to the late Head Master.*

After thirty-three years of congenial work, Dr. Malan at the end of 1905 handed over the school to the present Head Master, and retired to live at Winchester, followed by the affection and the hearty good wishes of a great number of old pupils in all parts of the world.

The first O.E.H. Dinner was started at this time to say good-bye to Dr. Malan and to wish his successor God-speed. The latter's first introduction to the story of Eagle House had been the accounts of Dr. Huntingford and reminiscences of the past which appeared in the School Magazine. The admiration for that personality and the interest in that past which were thus aroused, led me to a strong feeling that a school with such a history ought to have some permanent record in the form of a School Register.

This idea was warmly taken up by enthusiastic friends of the school, especially Miss H. Huntingford, Mr. G. S. Macquoid, and Mr. A. G. Malan. The project was mooted at the second Eagle House dinner and was received with great favour. Then followed a notice in the Magazine requesting old boys to send in particulars. Very few replied and the scheme hung fire for some time in view of the absolute impossibility of writing to every one on the lists kindly supplied by Miss Huntingford and Dr. Malan. At last Mr. A. G. Malan was inspired with the happy idea that information could be obtained from the Registers now issued by all the Public Schools.

This scheme met with my hearty approval, and Mr. Malan undertook to edit the register. For some six months he has worked hard consulting Public School Registers and writing to innumerable correspondents. It has been to him a labour of love and he is to be heartily congratulated on bringing it to a completion. Full lists of those who were at the school in the time of Dr. Huntingford and Dr. Malan are available and accurate information has been obtained about nearly all. For the periods of Mr. Railton and Mr. Wickham, no official lists have been found, and the editor has had to rely entirely on the information given by correspondents. It has therefore been impossible in the case of those before 1848 to classify the names according to the date of entry. This has been done from 1848 onwards but the earlier names are arranged in alphabetical order in two periods, the Railton period and the Wickham period. We do not know who entered that first Eagle House in 1820, but we do know that Mr. J. A. Morgan, still living at Clifton, Bristol, entered it in 1826, that is eighty-two years ago. Those who have any feeling for the school will doubtless be glad to possess a record which, beginning from such a date, goes down through the history of the school to the last little fellow who entered at the beginning of the present term. The continuity of the school, as one school from 1820, is undoubted. The mere change of situation is nothing. To any doubters it may be pointed out that Mrs. Malan was born in the first Eagle House, married in the second, and was Head Master's wife for twenty years in the third. The Old Motto of the School:—

“STAS, ET IN ÆTERNUM STES, AQUILINA DOMUS.”

will, I believe, best express the feelings of all “who have couched beneath the Eagle's wings.”

HEADMASTER, JOSEPH RAILTON, the son of a 'Cumberland statesman,' b. 1779, at Whitrigg, in the parish of Torpenhow, in Cumberland. "As a youngster, he crossed the common every morning to 'the Free School,' at Bothel, three miles away—a crust of dry bread in his pocket for his dinner, and slaking his thirst in the Ellerbeck, on his way to and from School." (*Extract from Nicholson Burne's 'History of Cumberland and Westmoreland,' published in 1777.*)

After teaching at Bassenthwaite, a neighbouring village, he went to London; and in 1820 he founded a School for the sons of gentlemen, at Eagle House, Brook Green, Hammersmith. Mr. Railton's success was in some degree due to the care with which Mrs. Jones, the Matron, looked after the boys, and even more to the skill with which he chose his assistant masters. He used to say: "I lead my 'sons' to the door of the House of Commons, and there I leave them." In 1833, he married Marianne Letitia Serjeant, a lady well known at the Court of George III. He settled down on an estate at Snittlegarth, in his native parish, and for many years he acted as Justice of the Peace for the County at the market town of Wigton. He died in 1857.

The News

CANNIZARO IN 1860

THIS week we have pleasure in publishing some more interesting reminiscences of Canon H. W. Boustead.

IN 1860 we moved to Cannizaro, Wimbledon; landlord, Mr. Drax; lease, 7, 14, 21 years, at £300 a year. There were 50 acres of grounds, garden, fields and wood, and right of access to the Warren Farm, some 250 acres. The Warren, where now the Royal Golf Club is, was absolutely delightful, with fine views of Epsom, Coombe Wood and Richmond Park. The staff was a large one. Three in the kitchen, three in the laundry, a butler (old MacGill) and footman, three housemaids and a lady's maid. Outside there were six gardeners, a carpenter (Dibley), who interested us much by saying that he nailed the oak shingle to the spire of the Parish Church with his own hand.

The coachman (Payne) and stable-hand (George), who could never master London, but insisted on driving first to Victoria Station, and thence proceeding to the place required.

We were a large and happy family. A former butler, Cracknell, had been with my parents some years. On leaving us he went round the world, a feat of no small adventure in those days, before the Suez or Panama Canals were thought of.

He brought back a present to my mother, two striking, deeply carved Chinese frames, with beautiful miniatures of two saints in them. I still have them and they still seem a symbol of that devoted relationship between employer and employed, which then in so many cases prevailed.

Gored to Death

A REAL tragedy darkened our stay at Cannizaro. At the farm was a bull, a beautiful creature, a ring through its nose, and seemingly docile to those it liked, which included the bailiff's wife. The bailiff, on the other hand, seemed unable to control the animal. One still, calm evening, the bull was tethered by a long chain attached to its neck, reaching to an iron stake attached to the ground. It was in the lower field, next to the 18 acre hayfield, and between the wood and the Warren, separated from the wood by a ditch and low fence. What caused the violence of the bull we never knew, but suddenly all heard a shriek, so awful and so loud that it reached even to the village. Many rushed to help towards the sound of a man clearly in deadly peril or pain.

It seemed that the bull, infuriated by something, caught sight of the bailiff, and, rushing towards him, had actually broken the links of the chain, and got the bailiff in the ditch beside the fence, trampling on him and goring him to death.

The bull was secured by farm hands, and the bailiff was borne to his house, where he died.

It was a terrible shock to us all. The widow continued with us, but money compensation could not bring back her husband, nor could the world ever seem the same as before.

Wimbledon House

WIMBLEDON HOUSE estate stretched from Marryat-road to Somerset-road, and from the old red-brick wall, which ran the length of Parkside, known then as London-road, to the borders of Wimbledon Park, containing a lake, now in the garden of Margin House, and paddocks and shelter for many animals and birds. Sir Henry Peak lived there; his only son, Cuthbert Peak, was at the time at Eagle House, where my brother Jack was. Cuthbert had a habit of climbing the wall that separated the cricket field of Eagle House from his father's property. Sir Henry and my father used to dispute which of the two boys secured the most canings. My father suffered from not infrequent colds in the head, and Sir Henry, when obliged to admit the frequent punishment of his son, retaliated, "Oh, Boustead, colds always go to the weakest part" He, the ultra successful merchant, my father, with a head, brought up on the classics and "belles lettres" of English literature.

ILLUSTRATOR OF FAIRY
TALES

Mr. Henry Justice Ford, the artist, who died on November 19 at the age of 81, was well-known as a gifted, imaginative illustrator, with a fine command of detail. Of him L. D. L. writes:—

The name of Henry Justice Ford was familiar from the 1880's to innumerable children as that of the illustrator of the Andrew Lang Fairy Story books, the wide success of which was due to his illustrations. Every year his inexhaustible fancy produced illustrations, decorative, charming, and sometimes a little alarming, of princes and princesses and fairies, demons, and animals in these and many other books. For painting he had little time, and it is by his illustrations he is remembered, though he never had quite the reputation as an artist he desired, perhaps, because he was reckoned "only an illustrator." He was the last of seven brothers, of whom the best-known to the public were Dr. Lionel Ford, Headmaster of Harrow, Walter Ford, the musician, and F. G. J. Ford, the left-handed cricketer. A cricketer himself, and in his day captain of the Repton XI, Henry Justice Ford was also a scholar, taking at Cambridge a first in Classics. Those who knew him will remember his charming presence, and his enthusiasm for what he admired and enjoyed, which was very delightful.

SIR HUMPHRY DAVY ROLLESTON

EMINENT PHYSICIAN AND MEDICAL EDITOR

Sir Humphry Davy Rolleston, Bt., G.C.V.O., K.C.B., M.D., for many years Physician-in-Ordinary to King George V, and from 1925 to 1932 Regius Professor of Physic at Cambridge, died at his home at Haslemere, Surrey, yesterday, at the age of 82.

The record of his busy life will be read with interest by all who believe in the force of heredity, for his talent and power of work were derived directly from his father and indirectly through his mother. He was born at Oxford on June 21, 1862, the eldest son of Professor George Rolleston, D.M., F.R.S., his mother being the daughter of Dr. John Davy, and therefore a niece of Sir Humphry Davy, the natural philosopher, who was President of the Royal Society in 1820. Professor Rolleston, the Linacre Professor of Anatomy and Physiology in the University of Oxford, was one of the chief allies of Sir Henry Acland in promoting the study of Natural Science in the University, and to him in great part Oxford owed the improved water supply and the system of drainage which succeeded the wells and latrines which were a legacy of medieval sanitation.

The most modest and unassuming of men, Rolleston succeeded in doing a very large amount of official work in the medical profession with a minimum of friction. His pleasant voice, conciliatory manner, and persuasive powers enabled him to carry many contentious matters to a satisfactory conclusion. It was felt too that any committee over which he presided would come to a prompt decision. He was a particularly skilful editor, knowing how to get the best out of authors, and a recognized expert in the preparation of scientific papers.

Humphry Rolleston was educated at Marlborough and at St. John's College, Cambridge, where he was a scholar. He gained a first class in both parts of the Natural Sciences Tripos in 1885 and 1886, and in 1889 was elected to a Fellowship. He received his medical education at St. Bartholomew's Hospital, became M.D. at Cambridge in 1891, and was admitted a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians in 1894. Soon afterwards he was elected assistant physician to St. George's Hospital and to the Victoria Hospital for Children in Tite Street, Chelsea, and in due course became physician and consulting physician to both institutions. On the outbreak of the South African War he was appointed consulting physician to the Imperial Yeomanry Hospital at Pretoria.

Returning to London at the end of the campaign he soon made a name for himself first as a pathologist, when pathology still meant morbid anatomy, and afterwards as the able and conscientious editor of Allbutt's "System of Medicine," as well as by numerous papers and addresses on medical subjects which were original and well expressed. Rolleston's other major editorial work included the "British Encyclopaedia of Medical Practice," published in 1936, and the main direction of the well known medical monthly, the *Practitioner*, since 1928, together with various volumes issued by that periodical. He served as president of the Royal College of Physicians from 1922 to 1926, having already been president of the Royal Society of Medicine from 1918 to 1920. When Sir Clifford Allbutt died in 1925, Sir Humphry Rolleston was nominated to succeed him as Regius Professor of Physic in the University of Cambridge, a position which it had long been recognized that he was especially qualified to fill.

Sir Humphry Rolleston served as a member of the General Medical Council, first as a representative of the Royal College of Physicians and secondly as the representative of the University of Cambridge; as chairman of the Executive Committee of the Imperial Cancer Research Fund; as a Trustee of the British Museum; and as a member of the Medical Administrative Committee of the Royal Air Force. He was Physician-in-Ordinary to King George V from 1923 to 1932 and Physician Extraordinary from 1932 to 1936. During the 1914-18 war he served as consulting physician to the Navy with the temporary rank of Surgeon Rear-Admiral (1915-18). In 1916 he was made a C.B. and in 1918 was advanced to K.C.B. He was created a baronet of Upper Brook Street, County of London, in 1924 and a G.C.V.O. in 1929. He married, in 1894, Lisette Eila, daughter of Mr. F. M. Ogilvy, and had two sons; the elder, Francis Lancelot, was killed in Flanders in 1915; and the younger, Ian Humphry Davy, was killed in riots in Zanzibar in February, 1936. The baronetcy therefore becomes extinct.

FORMER BISHOP OF NORWICH

The Right Reverend Bertram Pollock, K.C.V.O., D.D., Bishop of Norwich from 1910 to 1942, and formerly Master of Wellington College, died at his home at Gissing, Norfolk, on Sunday night after a short illness [as briefly announced in our later editions yesterday] at the age of 79. By his death the Church of England loses one of its most brilliant and most individual leaders, whose ability, perhaps, never could find full scope in an organization where the spirit of fellowship is necessarily of more value than a rigid independence.

Bertram Pollock was born on December 6, 1863, the youngest son of Mr. G. F. Pollock, formerly Senior Master of the Supreme Court and King's Remembrancer, and grandson of the late Right Hon. Sir Frederick Pollock, Lord Chief Baron. The late Lord Hanworth, Master of the Rolls, was his brother. Pollock was a scholar at Charterhouse, and gained a scholarship at Trinity College, Cambridge, taking a first class in the Classical Tripos of 1885. He proceeded D.D. in 1903. He was a good athlete, and represented his university against Oxford in the quarter-mile race of 1886, in which year he became an assistant master at Marlborough. Four years later he was ordained. He was under 30 years of age when he was appointed Master of Wellington College in 1893.

Pollock went to Wellington at a time when the finances and the numbers were at a low ebb. In a year or so the conditions under which the sons of officers were received at a school primarily intended for them were placed on a more equitable basis, and in another year the numbers had risen from 360 to 470; when in 1910 he laid down the reins the school numbered 502. The number of entrance scholarships was increased and their basis broadened, while a reform of the Army class began to bear fruit. As a result of careful and well directed economy building became possible in 1902, which culminated in a new hall in time for the jubilee of the college in 1909. Meanwhile, the interests of the assistant masters were recognized by the introduction of a retirement scheme, and by the improved discipline which ensued on a remodelling of the prefectorial body a firm hand was kept on the general tone of the school.

There was no hurry nor any failure about these changes; they worked well, because they were the outcome of a practical foresight, a close attention to detail, and unremitting labour. Pollock had an exceptional memory, and he was accessible on any subject and at all times. His words were weighed, and his temper was under complete control; he never made mistakes of inadvertence. He had

giving, and those who will remember it with gratitude are many.

When his appointment to the Bishopric of Norwich was announced he was an untried man in the general work of the Church. Except for an occasional sermon before his own university and a visit or two to Oxford, or when in his turn he preached in the Chapel Royal, he was unknown as a preacher. Neither High nor Low Churchman could claim him for an ally. This to the general body of Churchmen was a recommendation. When, however, he entered on his duties the clergy at once found that their Bishop was in touch with all that concerned them, and he quickly made his influence felt, showed remarkable ability in the management of diocesan affairs, and maintained a high spiritual level in everything he did. He began to develop a scheme for increasing the endowments of poor benefices, and declared himself ready to support a well-considered scheme for a division of the diocese. He spoke strongly against the disestablishment and disendowment of the Church.

During the struggle over the Prayer-book Revision he bore the chief part on the negative side. He remained, it is true, what he had been before, detached from any party, and constantly referred to Bishop Westcott as his master. But his opposition to certain features of the revision was obviously sincere and convinced. He was ready to go any distance to address large meetings in any diocese. The audiences provided the enthusiasm, and he provided the dry light of his conviction. In the debates which led to the Revised Book or decided its fate in Parliament, he was less effective. He was essentially a solitary man, and for a time he separated himself from the Lambeth discussions in order to assure his complete independence.

To considerations which have led to the forming of various new and more "manageable" dioceses in recent times, Dr. Pollock was hostile. A diocesan, he argued, should be a person of real importance; a Bishop ought not to be continually appearing in his parishes to perform minor ceremonies; it was no part of a Bishop's true function to run round among his clergy. He wrote a pamphlet or two embodying these views, defended them in talk, and carried them into practice. Yet if in his public life Dr. Pollock seemed at times angular, it was a very different character which was disclosed to all, clergy or layfolk, who knew him in private, for he showed abundantly that alluring quality known as "charm." He was the very soul of kindness; he was to those who knew him best an ideal companion, a sagacious counsellor, a magnificent friend.

Dr. Pollock married in 1928 Joan Florence Helena, daughter of the Rev. A. C. D. Ryder, and they had a daughter. He was the author of "The Church and English Life" (1932), "Church and State" (1936), and several other publications, including a collection of Wellington sermons and a small but attractive Latin treatise on the phrase, "Son of Man," written as a thesis for his doctorate in Divinity. In 1939 he became chairman of the Canterbury Convocation Committee for the revision of the Lectionary, an office he retained until his resignation of the bishopric of Norwich last year.

MR. W. L. SCLATER

SERVICES TO ORNITHOLOGY

By the death of William Lutley Sclater from enemy action, in his 81st year, zoology, and more particularly ornithology, has lost a most distinguished devotee.

He was born on September 23, 1863, and was the eldest son of Philip Lutley Sclater, F.R.S., for a long time secretary of the Zoological Society, and of Jane Anne Eliza, daughter of Sir David Hunter Blair, 3rd Baronet. He was educated at Winchester and Keble College, Oxford, where he graduated with first-class honours in Natural Science in 1885. From his father he inherited strong scientific tastes, and after spending two years at University College, London, and at Cambridge, under Adam Sedgwick, as demonstrator, he went, in 1886, to British Guiana to collect specimens of natural history, bringing back living examples of *Peripatus*. In 1887 he was appointed deputy superintendent of the Indian Museum, Calcutta, a post which he held until 1891, when he went to Eton as a science master. From Eton he accepted, in 1895, the directorship of the South African Museum, Capetown; and in 1896 he married in London Charlotte Seymour, daughter of William P. Mellen, of Colorado Springs, United States.

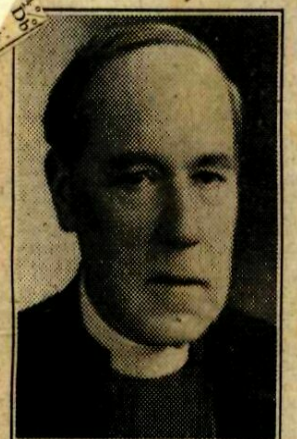
During his tenure of office the Capetown Museum collections were moved to new buildings and rearranged; and Sclater made his great contributions to literature, editing the first two volumes of the Fauna of South Africa, Birds, and writing the last two volumes after the death of Dr. Stark. It proved a standard work. He was also responsible for the two volumes on Mammals in the same series and established the "Annals of the South African Museum." In 1906 he returned to England, travelling from Mombasa to Cairo via Victoria Nyanza, the White Nile, and Khartoum. Resigning his post at Capetown, he proceeded to Colorado Springs to manage the Museum connected with Colorado College at the invitation of General William J. Palmer, his wife's brother-in-law.

From 1909 onwards until his death he worked on the supernumerary staff of the Natural History Museum and devoted himself entirely to ornithology. In 1912 he published his History of the Birds of Colorado and completed the final volume of Shelley's Birds of Africa. Sclater had an excellent knowledge of the classics, and his wise counsel was often sought by colleagues in the Bird Room, who looked to him for guidance on nomenclature and classification. Though chiefly a Museum systematist, he had many other interests, and with his wife travelled extensively. In 1919-20 they made a journey round the world. He was an honorary secretary of the Royal Geographical Society from 1931 till 1944, and his reviews in its *Journal* showed a sympathetic understanding and scholarly pen. As a writer he was perhaps at his best as a historian as he proved by his volume on Sterne's Eliza (1922); his contributions to the *Ibis* (to the editorship of which he succeeded his father) on early ornithologists, showed his gift for historical research. In 1938 he edited and partly wrote "The Birds of Kenya Colony and the Uganda Protectorate," based on the manuscript of Sir Frederick Jackson, but his greatest contribution to ornithology was the compilation of the *Systema Avium Aethiopicarum* (1930), upon which all future works on African birds must be based.

Sclater joined the British Ornithologists Union in 1891, was president in 1928, and two years later was awarded the Godman-Salvin gold medal. No one who came in contact with him could fail to be impressed by his kindness of heart and genial disposition. He and his wife entertained hospitably before her death two years ago. The place which he made for himself in many spheres will be impossible to fill.

DEATH OF VISCOUNT SANDHURST.

The King's Condolence.

We regret to announce that Viscount Sandhurst, who had been Lord Chamberlain since February, 1912, when he succeeded his brother-in-law, Earl Spencer, in that office, died yesterday in London. He had been lying ill at the King Edward VII. Hospital for Officers, Grosvenor-crescent, for some weeks past.

The King and Queen, who had displayed throughout the illness of Lord Sandhurst the keenest sympathy and concern, and had made constant inquiries, have sent a message of their sincere condolence to Viscountess Sandhurst and other bereaved relatives. The regret felt by their Majesties is fully shared by all connected with the Lord Chamberlain's department, over which Lord Sandhurst ruled for nearly ten years. He was regarded not merely with respect, but with keen affection throughout the department.

William Mansfield, first Viscount Sandhurst, was the eldest son of the first Baron and Margaret, youngest daughter of Robert Fellowes, of Shotesham, Norfolk. He was born in 1855, and was educated at Rugby, becoming subsequently a lieutenant in the Coldstream Guards. He succeeded his father, the distinguished soldier, in 1876. He was a Lord-in-Waiting to Queen Victoria throughout Mr. Gladstone's second Government from 1880 to 1885, and was twice Under Secretary of State for War, first in 1886 and again from 1892 to 1895, filling the post of Governor of Bombay from 1895 to 1900. He was an honorary Colonel of the Bombay Vounteers. In 1906 he was one of the committee sent to South Africa to inquire and report as to the form of constitution to be granted to the Transvaal and the Orange River Colonies. In 1915 he became a member of the Government Committee for Employment of Disabled Soldiers and Sailors. He was a very popular Court official, and showed great ability in the execution of his duty as Lord Chamberlain, an appointment which includes such delicate duties as checking the lists of people who wish to be presented and issuing passes for the Royal enclosure at Ascot.

Lord Sandhurst married first, in 1881, Lady Victoria Alexandrina Spencer, who died in 1906, and secondly, in 1909, the Hon. Eleanor Mary Caroline, daughter of Matthew Arnold, and widow of the Hon. Armine Wodehouse, M.P., son of the first Earl of Kimberley. The Barony was created in 1871. Lord Sandhurst, who was a Knight of Justice of St. John of Jerusalem and a Magistrate for Middlesex, was made a Knight Grand Commander of the Indian Empire in 1895, and a Knight Grand Commander of the Star of India in 1900; becoming a Privy Councillor in 1906, and a Knight Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order in 1916. Later in that year he received a Viscounty on the retirement of Mr. Asquith, taking the title of Viscount Sandhurst of Sandhurst, in the county of Berkshire.

LORD DONERAILE

MUNICIPAL LIFE IN
WESTMINSTER

Viscount Doneraile, who for many years has been well known in the municipal life of Westminster, died on Sunday, at Doneraile Court.

The Right Hon. Edward St. Leger, sixth Viscount Doneraile and Baron Doneraile, of Doneraile, County Cork, in the Peerage of Ireland, was the eldest son of a great-grandson of the first Viscount of the second creation, the Rev. Edward Frederick St. Leger, Rector of Scotton, Lincolnshire, and was a nephew of the fifth Viscount. Born at Scotton Rectory on October 6, 1866, he was educated at Winchester, 1880-84, and at New College, Oxford, where he graduated in 1889. In 1891 he succeeded his uncle in the peerage, and in the same year was called to the Bar by the Inner Temple. He settled in the City of Westminster, and most of his public work was municipal. He became manager of a Metropolitan Asylums district in 1899, and from 1928 until 1930 was chairman of the Metropolitan Asylums Board. He was an alderman of Westminster, and in 1919-20 was mayor of that city. For his services during the last War he was appointed an officer of the Legion of Honour. He took much interest in skating, and became president of the National Skating Association. Lord Doneraile was unmarried, and is succeeded by his brother, the Hon. Hugh St. Leger, who was born on August 6, 1869, and raised to the rank of the younger son of a viscount in 1892. The new peer married on December 18, 1919, Mary Isobel, daughter of Mr. Francis Morice, of Whakapuntanake, Gisborne, New Zealand. There is no issue of this marriage, and a cousin becomes the new heir-presumptive.

The original line of St. Leger, Viscounts Doneraile, ended in the male line in 1767 with the death of the fourth and last Viscount of the 1703 creation. Major-General Anthony St. Leger, of Park Hill, Doncaster, after whom the now famous classic race was named in 1778, was a nephew of the first Viscount. The extensive estates in Co. Cork were left by the fourth Viscount to his nephew, St. Leger Aldworth, who took the name of St. Leger, and became Baron Doneraile in 1776, and Viscount Doneraile in 1785 of the second creation. This peer's mother, Elisabeth St. Leger, daughter of the first Viscount of the old creation, and sister of the fourth and last Viscount, was the only woman ever admitted a Freemason. According to G. E. C., "The Complete Peerage," "This was owing to her having, as a girl (say in 1710, when she was 17), witnessed, unseen, the ceremonies at her father's house, long before the Grand Lodge of Ireland was founded (1729-30). She married in 1713 and died in 1773, aged 80. Portraits of her in her masonic apron still exist." The second Viscount of the present house received £15,000 when Doneraile was disfranchised after the Union.

Doneraile was a frequent guest of the Fellowes family at Overwallops Rectory where I met him several times, in the 'nineties: also at New College Gaudy, 1936. W. Nelson

SIRE EVAN MACONOCHIE

AN EMINENT BOMBAY CIVILIAN.

We regret to announce that Sir Evan Maconochie, K.C.I.E., C.S.I., one of the most distinguished of retired Bombay Civilians, died at his residence at Upway, Seaton, Devon, on Sunday, at the age of 59.

One of the best of his many services to the British Raj was rendered after his retirement five years ago. At that time there were serious difficulties in securing an adequate supply of European candidates of the accustomed high calibre for the I.C.S., and the authorities were so much concerned that the whole position was investigated by a Royal Commission. The recruiting speeches made at the universities by men of distinction in the Indian service, past and present, and by some leading statesmen, and the ameliorative recommendations of the Lee Commission, were supplemented by Sir Evan's quite independent but attractive picture of conditions, present as well as past, in his book of reminiscences, "Life in the Indian Civil Service," published in the summer of last year. Regarding himself as a typical civilian (though the lines usually fell to him in pleasant places), he did not hide the shadows and difficulties of "exile," but showed how many are the compensations when a man puts his heart into his work and takes from life in India all the charm and colour it can give. There can be no doubt that the book has contributed to the present satisfactory revival of interest in I.C.S. careers at our great public schools and universities.

Evan Maconochie had the closest family ties with official life. He was born on July 8, 1868, to Mr. Alexander Maconochie, a Home Office official. In 1899 he married Margaret Lucy, daughter of his then chief, Sir Denzil Ibbotson, one of the most gifted Indian civilians of his day, whose term as Lieutenant-Governor of the Punjab was cut short by resignation on account of mortal illness within ten months of taking office. Their family consists of three sons and a daughter.

From Sherborne School Evan Maconochie passed the examination of 1887 and went up to New College, Oxford. The family has been represented in the Indian Services for more than 150 years, and when he went out to Bombay in 1889, his senior brother was in the service there. He served as assistant collector and settlement officer, with a term as acting Administrator of the Sachin State. His good work in minute analysis of land values for the purpose of land revenue brought him into intimate touch with the peasantry and led to his selection to be Ibbotson's Under-Secretary in the Revenue and Agricultural Department of the Government of India. It is typical of his lively, agreeable temperament that he formed a much less qualified admiration of Lord Curzon than most of the Secretariat officers whose drafts the Viceroy criticized so candidly.

By what he always regarded as a lucky chance, Maconochie was offered in 1902 the private secretaryship to the Maharajah of Mysore, who had come of age and been invested with ruling powers. He helped in the development of the capacity and personal charm of the young ruler of the "Model State," and enjoyed to the full his seven years' tenure. Returning to his own presidency in 1909, he served first as a collector and later as a Commissioner. As Agent to the Governor in Kathiawar from the end of 1915, he had experience of backward as well as progressive States. In Junagadh, for instance, he found administration chaotic; on the death of the Nawab "the whole place was a hotbed of rivalries and intrigue"; it was full of palace parasites, and the whole duty of "some hundreds of them was to keep a fighting-cock." Maconochie, who was well liked by the Chiefs as well as by the people, supported the fiscal changes carried out in 1917, which gave facilities to certain maritime States now the subject of controversy leading to the re-establishment of the Viramgam Customs line. After a spell of ordinary administrative work in Dharwar (the Southern Division), Maconochie retired at the end of 1922. He had been created C.S.I. in 1918, and K.C.I.E. in 1921. Always an enthusiast, he loved his Indian gardens, his horses, his gun, and his fishing-rod, but he loved still more his work and the people whom he served.

SIR ARMINE DEW

ADMINISTRATION OF BALUCHISTAN

Colonel Sir Armine Brereton Dew, K.C.I.E., C.S.I., who was a successful Chief Commissioner of Baluchistan at a time of exceptional strain 20 years ago, died in Kensington on June 7 at the age of 73.

Born on September 27, 1867, the son of Major Frederick Napleton Dew, he entered the Army from Wellington in 1888 and joined the famous Queen's Own Corps of Guides. He served in the Hazara (Black Mountain) expedition in 1891. He was attached to the Gilgit Agency at the close of 1894 and joined the Political Department four years later. He was successively political agent in Gilgit and Kalat, and in the latter post had charge of the Bolan Pass. He was made Revenue and Judicial Commissioner in Baluchistan at the end of 1917 and in September, 1919, succeeded the late Sir H. R. Dobbs as Agent to the Governor-General and Chief Commissioner in Baluchistan. His administration there was a wonderful triumph for a strong personality in the midst of the troubled area of Persia to the west and Afghanistan (then lately at war with us) to the north-west, and with Waziristan a hotbed of raiding activity. Moreover, owing to the Caliphate agitation in India and the ill-starred *hijrat* (migration) of Mohamedans, Sind, in the words of a Baluch chief, became a more dangerous frontier to Baluchistan than Afghanistan. The administration was marked by confidence in the people and consultation with their leaders on all matters. Dew had the full co-operation of his wife, daughter of a distinguished political, the late Sir Adelbert Talbot, in this policy; and when they left Quetta in June, 1922, a farewell ceremony included the opening of the Lady Dew Purdah Club. His son, Mr. Armine R. Dew, was first secretary to the British Legation at Belgrade.

DR. F. R. C. REED

Dr. Frederick Richard Cowper Reed, Sc.D., F.G.S., F.R.G.S., died in Cambridge on Friday [as recorded in our later editions on Saturday].

As an undergraduate he was a Scholar of Trinity College, where he soon made his mark as a student of geology. For many years he was assistant to the Woodwardian Professor Thomas McKenny Hughes, and in that capacity was largely responsible for arranging the collections in the Old Woodwardian museum and for transferring them to the present Sedgwick museum in 1904. His life's work in Cambridge was that of a curator rather than of a lecturer. He completed a large volume on palaeontological research, much of which has been published by the Indian Geological Survey in the *Palaeontologica Indica*. His best known work is the "Geology of the British Empire," which led him through almost all the Dominions and Colonies. In his early years his research lay mainly in Ireland. In later life he wrote extensively on the Shelly fauna of the palaeozoic rocks.

Dr. Cowper Reed was of a retiring nature, and throughout his life devoted himself to his work with a determination which often led him along the more solitary ways. But those who knew him best were aware of the abundant kindness which he kept in his heart for his friends, and of the *mitis sapientia* which adorned his industrious life. He is survived by his wife, who was his companion throughout his travels.

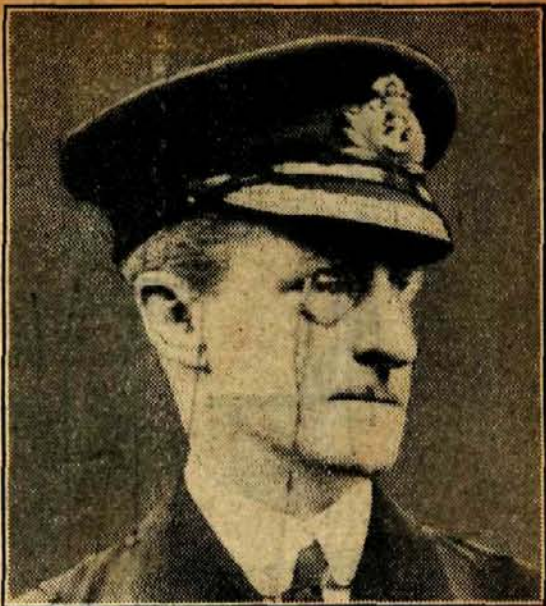

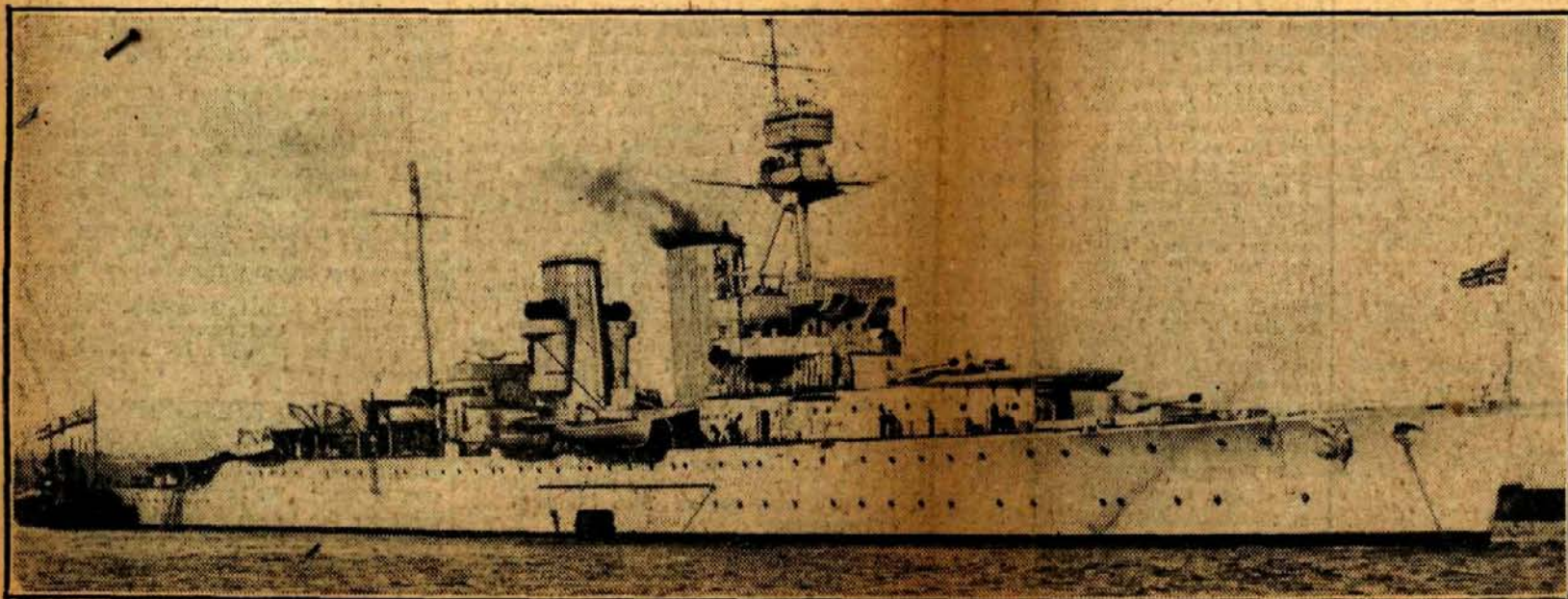

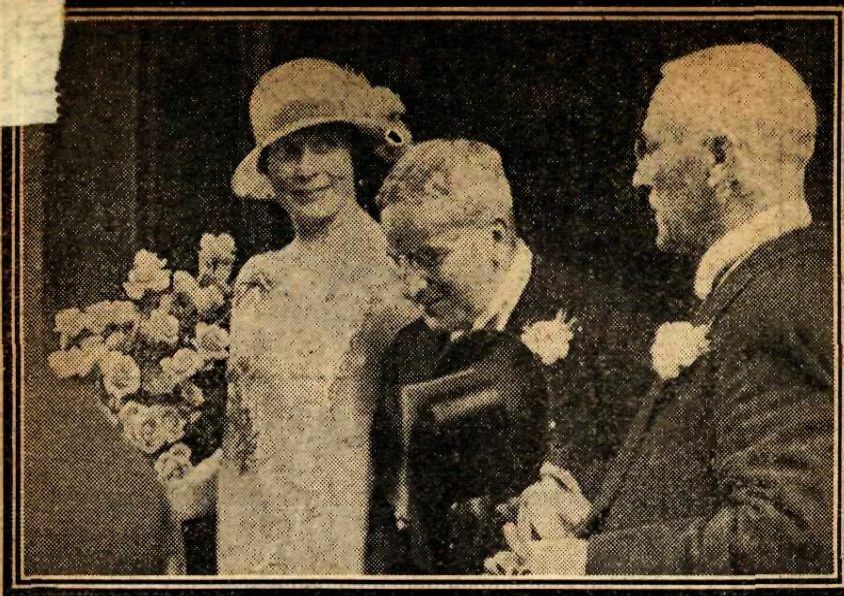

COMMANDER J. A. SLEE, R.N.

Commander F. G. Loring, R.N.,

writes:—

Commander J. A. Slee, C.B.E., M.I.E.E., F.I.R.E., R.N. (retired), who died recently at the age of 65, was closely concerned with the framing of the radio regulations which were drawn up at the international radiocommunication conferences held in London (1912), Washington (1927), Madrid (1932), and Cairo (1938). He also attended the various technical conferences held by the International Consultative Committee for Radiocommunications (C.C.I.R.) and by the International Broadcasting Union (U.I.R.). At all of these, except London (1912), which he attended as an Admiralty representative, he represented the interests of the Marconi International Marine Communication Company, which he joined on his retirement from the Navy in 1920 owing to defective eyesight. John Ambrose Slee entered the Navy through the Britannia in 1892 and qualified in H.M.S. Vernon as a torpedo and wireless specialist in 1902. He was very versatile, and was commended by the Admiralty for the design of an automatic ammunition supply for 6in. guns, and for a scheme for the defence of harbours against torpedo attack. Later he turned his attention to the adaption of supersonic signals to depth sounding by timing their reflection from the bed of the ocean. Before he retired from the Navy Commander Slee held appointments as officer-in-charge of Admiralty coast wireless and signalling stations, and as head of the (Services) Wireless Board. For his work in the latter appointment he was made a C.B.E. in 1919. A correspondent writes:—

To all the friends who held such warm personal affection the death of Francis Lawrence Bland will bring great sadness. The country has lost a banker of real distinction and ability and the county of Suffolk a public-spirited and outstanding figure. Lawrence Bland was a great example of the country banker, and he would have been proud to have been so described. Banking was in his blood, for he came from banking stock and devoted his life to the pursuit of a calling to which he added lustre and which gave him full scope for his considerable abilities. A countryman at heart and an ardent lover of his own county of Suffolk, he brought a practised and sympathetic mind to bear on the various problems which came before him in the bank and in his public life. For him nothing was too much trouble if it helped to solve the difficulties or clear the doubts of another. Pervading his whole being was the quality of generous-hearted friendliness.

There will be many who will remember with deep affection his glowing personality, the warmth of his greeting, his face wreathed in smiles—the enthusiasm brimming over which belied his age. His memory lies enshrined in the hearts of many, and they that could count Lawrence Bland among their friends are fortunate and strengthened, for they have his shining example to help them on their way.

Major SPENCER MAXWELL TAHOURDIN, 12th Cavalry, Indian Army (died of wounds on February 8), was the eldest son of the Rev. Richard Tahourdin, honorary chaplain to the King, and of Mrs. Richard Tahourdin, of Queen's-gate-gardens. Born in August, 1875, he was gazetted to the Indian Army in December, 1896. He was promoted in November, 1897, and again in August, 1904, while in August, 1913, he received his majority. From January, 1904, to August, 1906, he was employed with the King's African Rifles.

THE LATE MAJOR S. M. TAHOURDIN.

A Memorial Service for Major Spencer Maxwell Tahourdin, 12th Cavalry, Indian Army, eldest son of the late Rev. Richard Tahourdin, Hon. Chaplain to the King, and of Mrs. Richard Tahourdin, who died in Mesopotamia on the 8th inst., after having been wounded in action the previous day, was held yesterday afternoon at St. Paul's Church, Knightsbridge. Canon Edgar Sheppard, D.D., Sub-Dean of the Chapels Royal, officiated, and the other clergy taking part in the service were Prebendary Leith Boyd, vicar of St. Paul's, and the Rev. H. R. L. Sheppard, vicar of St. Martin's-in-the-Fields. In addition to Mrs. Richard Tahourdin and several members of the family there were present: Colonel Carleton and Colonel Lynch (12th Cavalry), Lady Duckworth, Clara Lady Vincent, Lady Davson, Mrs. Whitelaw Reid, Mrs. Sheppard, and Colonel and Mrs. Myers. At the conclusion of the service the congregation sang the National Anthem, and the buglers and drummers of the 5th (Reserve) Battalion Grenadier Guards, stationed in the gallery, sounded the Last Post.

Major EDWARD SINCLAIR GOOCH, Berkshire Yeomanry (died in London on September 21 of wounds received in action in Gallipoli on August 21), was the son of the late Mr. J. V. Gooch and of Mrs. Gooch, of Coopers Hill, Bracknell. He was born in February, 1879, and educated at Winchester. Gazetted to the 7th Hussars in November, 1900, he went with his regiment to South Africa and served in the last two years of the war—1901-1902—and received the Queen's medal with five clasps. After retiring from the Hussars he joined the Berkshire Yeomanry, was promoted major in September, 1910, and was gazetted to the Reserve of Officers. He was in command of the Berkshire Yeomanry in the heavy fighting in the attack on Hill 60 last month in Gallipoli and greatly distinguished himself by his skilful and gallant leading over difficult country. The Berks Yeomanry was the leading regiment of the Brigade, and Major Gooch was actually the first in the trenches, where he received a bullet wound in the head. He was taken on board a hospital ship and brought home, and died at Lady Ridley's Hospital, 10, Carlton House-terrace, on Tuesday. Major Gooch was a good all-round sportsman, a capable officer, and was exceedingly popular with both his brother officers and men. He married in 1902 Eva, daughter of Mr. Everard Jones, of Feas Fern, Fort William, and leaves one daughter. The funeral of Major Gooch will take place at Fort William at mid-day on Saturday near his residence, Tor Castle, Banavie.

BRILLIANT MILITARY CAREER.

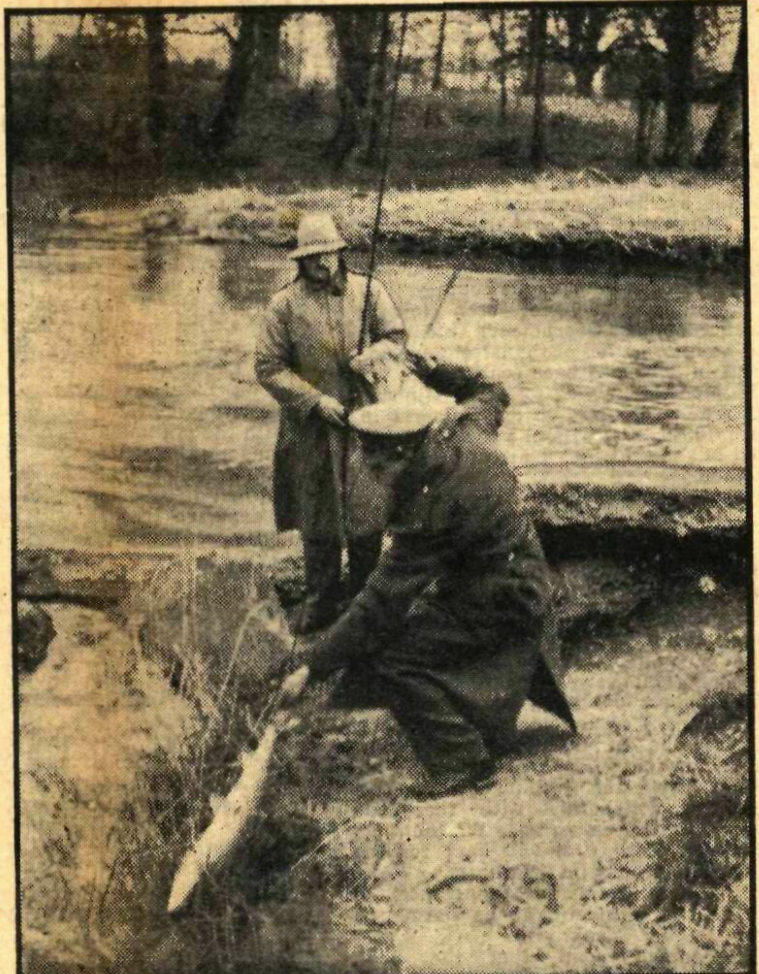

PERSONAL NOTES.

LIEUTENANT MAURICE RICHARD WHEATLEY JOHNSON, I.A.R.O., attached R.G.A., was the son of Brigadier-General R. F. Johnson, C.B., C.M.G., late Royal Artillery, and Mrs. Johnson. He was born in Dublin on June 10, 1889, and was educated at Eagle House, Sandhurst, Wellington College (Lynedock, Mr. Rogers), where he won the Prince Consort History Prize, and Pembroke College, Cambridge (Historical Tripos, Class II.). He entered the Indian Civil Service in 1912, and in November, 1913, was appointed Assistant Collector at Ahmedabad, in the Bombay Presidency. On the outbreak of war he applied to be allowed to join the I.A.R.O., but was not permitted to do so until August, 1916, by which time he had been Assistant Political Agent at Palanpur for nine months. He joined the R.G.A. at Lahore, and served with a Mountain Battery at Bannu, on the North-West Frontier. In March, 1918, he was sent to Mesopotamia, and was attached to the battery with which he was serving at the time of his death. The Chief Secretary to the Government of Bombay writes:—"Your son was a most promising member of the Civil Service, and most readily embraced the opportunity of serving his country on the battlefield."

The Needle's Eye, Mr. Denys Chataway's new play, which was given for the first time at the West Pier Theatre here last night, is an interesting piece. It possesses a good fundamental idea and a dramatic third act. The story deals with a man of many ideals. He is full of theories which are not improved by practice, and is such an egotist that his wife almost becomes a bigamist. While he is practising charity abroad she is practising the very opposite of good works at home, and it is only in the very middle of his self-sufficiency that he realizes that she is planning to be unfaithful to him. His philanthropy has been too general to be particular, with the result that while he has been trying to regenerate the human race his wife has been degenerating before him. But, as he discovers this, his wife is crippled in an accident, and with his interpretation of the accident as a Divine judgment the prologue is ended and the real action begins.

With the beginning of the drama the play strengthens, and from here until the end it is always interesting. In the midst of her pain the wife turns to her husband again, and he promises her, sooner than reveal that there is anything he cannot do, that she shall go to sleep and wake up healthy. He soon regrets this promise, but, of course, it is too late, and sooner than admit himself open to her reproach, he kills her. The scene that follows is admirably conceived, with the dead wife on the bed and the nerve-racked husband in the middle of the stage. Eventually his plan to meet her soon again after death is ruined by the fact that he is acquitted of her murder and that he does not commit suicide, as he has planned. There is here a highly melodramatic *peripeteia*, but the fact remains that, for nearly half an hour, the story and the dialogue are gripping in the extreme. That, in itself, is an achievement.

The acting was good. Mr. Edward Stirling as the husband put all he knew into the part. The result justified the means. Miss Dorothy Batley was an excellent contrast as his wife. Mr. Charles Bennett was sufficiently unpleasant as the lover, and Miss Germaine de Vaux made an amusing housemaid. She made of this character quite a credible person, and this in spite of the fact that the author had made her unexpectedly "chatty" in the presence of her superiors. Otherwise his character-drawing was firm and, mostly, quite realistic.

During the Lockhart regime, which lasted for nearly a quarter of a century, the school was run on the same lines as Loretto, the famous Scottish school founded by Dr. Almond, and the boys were subjected to a far more Spartan-like existence than is to be found in most English preparatory schools. Many a timid youngster, receiving his first hard knocks at Rugby football, found in Mrs. Lockhart exactly that right kind of sympathy which brought comfort to his wounded spirit and made him proud of his bruises. She possessed to a remarkable degree the happy knack of winning a young boy's confidence and of retaining that confidence long after the tender child had grown into a man. A native of the Highlands, she made her house a home for every boy, and her hospitality was truly Celtic in its lavishness. It was during the War, however, that her genius for friendship revealed itself in its highest form. Essentially a school for soldiers and for soldiers' sons, Eagle House has a roll of honour which is as long as that of many a public school. Throughout those dreary four-and-a-half years she maintained a remarkable correspondence with a whole army of old boys, and, although I can speak only for myself, I feel sure there were many of us who found a wonderful relief in unburdening our souls to her of those innermost thoughts which in the face of death we do not reveal even to our nearest and dearest. In this country, in India, and in all the outposts of the British Empire there will be many an old Eagle House boy to-day, who, in mourning her death, will feel that he has been deprived of one of the noblest influences in his life.

ROYAL AIR FORCE

SQUADRON LEADER KENNETH ALEXANDER KESWICK MAC EWEN, killed on active service, was the elder son of Air Vice-Marshal and Mrs. Norman MacEwen, of Camberley. He was granted a permanent commission as a pilot officer on January 25, 1929, and had previously held a commission as second lieutenant in The Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders (S.R.). After training at Digby, he joined an Army cooperation squadron, and later a fighter squadron. In 1931 he took the course for flying instructors, and was appointed to the staff at Cranwell. From 1932 to 1935 he was on the staff at a flying training school in Egypt. Two years followed in one of the home fighter squadrons, and in July, 1937, he was appointed chief flying examining officer at headquarters of a training group. He was promoted to flying officer in July, 1930, flight lieutenant in August, 1934, and squadron leader in July, 1938. He was married, in 1935, to Evelyn Roma, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Adrian Rome, of Penhalonga, Southern Rhodesia.

SQUADRON LEADER JOHN BERNARD FYFE, D.F.C., previously reported missing, now presumed killed in action, was commissioned as a pilot officer on probation on December 30, 1927, and joined an Army cooperation squadron. In October, 1929, he joined a similar squadron in India, where he served for five years, gaining the D.F.C. for active service operations in the summer of 1933. Early in 1935 he was appointed to the Experimental Section of the Royal Aircraft Establishment. In January, 1938, he assumed command of an Army cooperation squadron at home. He was promoted flying officer in June, 1929, flight lieutenant in April, 1933, and squadron leader in December, 1937.

ACTING FLIGHT LIEUTENANT DOUGLAS DAVIDSON MIDDLETON, previously missing, now presumed killed in action, was commissioned as an acting pilot officer on August 31, 1936. He had served in the Bomber Command since May, 1937.

FLYING OFFICER RICHARD LLOYD TANNER, killed on active service, was educated at Eagle House, Sandhurst, and at Marlborough. Before going to Cambridge he obtained a pilot's A certificate, and on entering Clare College in October, 1938, joined the University Air Squadron, which was embodied in the R.A.F.V.R. on the outbreak of war. He was gazetted pilot officer on October 3, 1939, and promoted flying officer in October, 1940, two months before his twenty-first birthday. He was the only son of Mr. and Mrs. E. L. Tanner.

PILOT OFFICER PETER GORDON HEDLEY SALMON, who was missing as the result of air operations on December 30, 1940, is now reported believed killed in action. He was 22 years of age, was educated at St. Edward's School, Oxford, and was commissioned in 1938. While finishing his training in Egypt he had the misfortune to fracture his spine and was for some time in the General Hospital at Ismalia. He was brought back to an R.A.F. hospital in England, where he made a complete recovery, and resumed flying in 1939. He was captain of his crew. f. 5. 41.
